<p>• Background WHO developed guidelines for integrated care for older people (ICOPE) at the system (macro) level by conducting an expert survey (Delphi survey) in 2017-2018.</p> <p>• Objective This study aimed to diagnose the Korean situation by collecting expert opinions on various projects and policies for older people that were implemented in Korea using the WHO-ICOPE framework.</p> <p>• Method A survey tool was constructed based on the WHO-ICOPE, and two rounds of expert surveys were conducted. The survey items were largely as follows: ① evaluating the extent to which domestic projects and policies were implemented at the service or system level and ② assessing the extent to which the items recommended as the basis for integrated elderly care by the WHO-ICOPE were implemented in Korea and their categorization into items to investigate opinions. The Delphi survey was conducted in two rounds. All surveys were conducted via e-mail. All survey items were analyzed by dividing the respondents into experts and project managers.</p> <p>• Results Both experts and project managers responded that the implementation in the service area was better than in the system area. In the service area, the question of “active efforts to identify older people in need of care” among “service adjustment and support provided by the provider at the multidisciplinary level” was generally implemented. Comparing the averages for each item, project managers got higher scores on many items than experts. Both the expert and the person in charge of the project responded that the implementation was better in the field of cognitive impairment. However, there were differences in the contents of the items.</p> <p>• Discussion and Conclusion This study contributes to finding a policy strategy for this by diagnosing the implementation of integrated management for older people in Korea.</p>	

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
